**UNDERGRADUATE  
CONCENTRATION IN REGIONAL STUDIES - LATIN AMERICA**

The Barnard **Minor** in Regional Studies in Latin America is designed to allow undergraduates for an interdisciplinary understanding of major issues in the region, such as political processes, historical developments, social changes, and crucial problems cutting across the hemisphere that require social scientific and historical grounding. The research seminar is a crucial component in providing students with the opportunity to apply the knowledge they have learned to a topic in the region. A minimum of 15 credits (a total of 5 courses) is needed to fulfill the requirements for the Minor in Regional Studies in Latin America.

Requirements for the Minor in Latin American and Caribbean Studies:

The minimum number of credits is 15 (5 courses).

A. **CORE COURSES:** One (1) courses from the following Four (4) courses.

1. HIST UN2660: Latin American civilization, I
2. HIST UN2661: Latin American civilization, II
3. LACV CC1020: Primary Texts of Latin American Civilization
4. POLS GU4461: Latin American Politics

B. **SPECIALIZED LECTURE/SEMINAR COURSES:** At least Two (2) from the list. Specialized course must be a Barnard course

1. ASFB BC2005: Caribbean Culture & Societies
2. AHIS BC2901: Contemporary Latin American Art
3. HIST BC2676: Reproducing Inequalities: Families in Latin America
4. HIST BC2681: Women and Gender in Latin America
5. POLS BC3543: Non-State Government Crime/War
6. POLS UN3560: Political Urban Development in Latin America
7. POLS V3565: Drugs and Politics in the Americas
8. SPAN UN3300: Advanced Language through Content (with Latin American focus)

C. **SEMINAR COURSE:** Students will take one seminar course in any department with DUS approval to develop an in-depth topic in the region. The seminar course must be a Barnard course

D. **ELECTIVE COURSE:** Students may take any courses related to Latin America. This course can be selected the core courses, specialized lecture/seminar courses or any other courses with approval from the DUS or Senior Manager of Business & Student Affairs.
